LSWC is dedicated to education. We strive to help new handlers and their dogs, frequently in field events. Weims are a versatile breed, and they fit in well with all breed field work.. However, this seminar is not just for Weims! It is especially for those of us who love to train our own dogs, start them out on birds properly, teach them to retrieve to hand and generally create a good working, hunting team.

Our goal is not to train you or your dog, but to teach you ways in which you can start your pup correctly and perhaps continue to train on your own. Pups will be introduced to both pigeons and quail. If appropriate to their age, they will be exposed to blank gunfire. Check cords and obedience techniques will also be approached. **Pups younger than 6 months will be limited to certain exercises and may not be a good choice for participation in the course.**

Naturally, this training can't all be done in a weekend. Our hope is that you will be inspired to enjoy training your gun dog, then participating in hunting, or achieving various field titles. We have experience in many areas and hope to be able to help you enjoy them as well.

DIRECTIONS: I-20 to Wills Point. Take Exit Number 519, the Turner – Hayden Exit. Go approximately 2 miles North on 3412 to the intersection of 3406/3412. Continue an additional quarter mile. Entrance to the ranch is on the right-hand side. Use the 2nd entrance closest to the white barn.

From Southeast: Take 64 in Canton. Cross over I-20. Turn left on VZCR 3406. (If you get to HWY 80 you've gone too far.) Turn right at the 1st intersection on to VZCR 3412. Ranch is the second drive on the right.

From HWY 80 in Wills Point: Go through Wills Point heading east. Veer right at the split on to HWY 64. Turn right on VZCR 3406. Turn right at the intersection on to VZCR 3412. Ranch is the second drive on the right.

Coordinates are N32.65078° W095.98235°

Camping is not available.
There is an RV park south of I-20 on VZCR 3412.

Saturday:

- Discuss your level of experience and that of your pup
- What you hope to achieve this weekend with your pup
- Introduction to birds
- Depending on age, pigeons and launchers may be used
- Opportunity to experience blank or live gunfire
- Introduction to check cord and obedience
- Important things to know: “Here”, “Fetch”, “Whoa”
- “My dog will retrieve anything”....until....

Both Mr. Martin and experienced club members will be available to help and answer questions.

Sunday:

- Discussion and questions from previous session
- Continue to create excitement for birds in your pup (and you!) while the morning is still cool enough
- Reconvene for more discussion. We're coming to the end of the seminar...."what do I do now?" Be sure to bring a notebook to make notes on how to continue the good work you've started. Where can you go for more guidance? How can you get birds? Where can they be kept for use? What other equipment do you need?

Things you will need:

- Crate, good ventilation and/or stake out for your pup
- Sturdy collar and leash
- Blank gun if you have one
- Water for dogs, chair for yourself
- Easy-up or shelter from sun if available, it will be hot
- BYO lunch and soft drinks. Water provided
